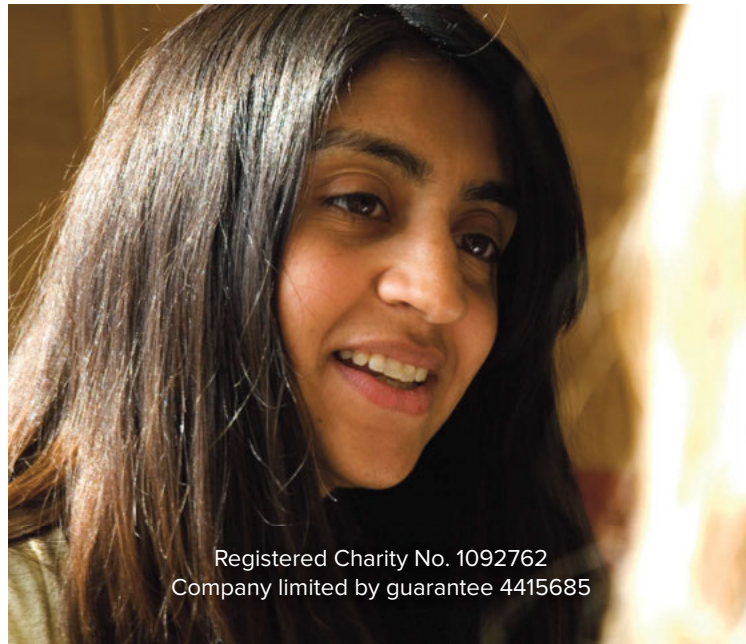

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Do you help or support someone?



Are you helping someone with everyday household tasks like shopping or cooking, or organising and transporting someone to medical appointments? You may also be helping with medication and treatment or personal care and help with mobility, or you may be providing emotional support.

Who is a carer?

A carer is someone who cares, unpaid, for a family member or friend who cannot always manage without their support. They might look after someone with a physical disability, long term health condition, mental health issue or a problem with substance misuse.



You might not think of yourself as a carer and think that what you do is just part of being a parent, spouse, good friend or sibling. As a result you might miss out on the support that is available.

Why does it matter?

Looking after someone can be a positive and rewarding experience, but it can also be exhausting, stressful and isolating. Many carers feel that they can't take a break because the person they look after can't be left alone. Caring for someone may also have a negative impact on your relationships, employment, finances and health.
